Your baby will find new ways of getting to things they want. They can't walk yet. But they can hold on to furniture and stand up. You need to make sure they stay safe.



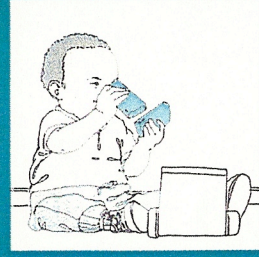
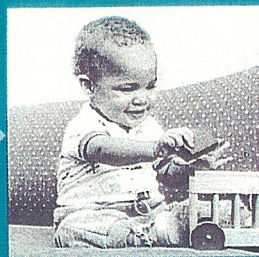
1. If your baby sees something they want, they will try to get it.

Your baby can use their hands to hold smaller things. They like to play with toys that they can hold onto and bang together.



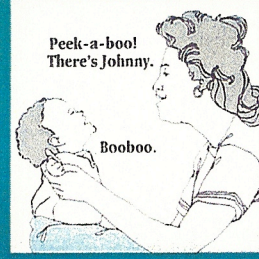
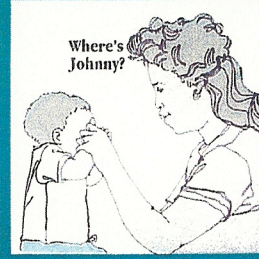
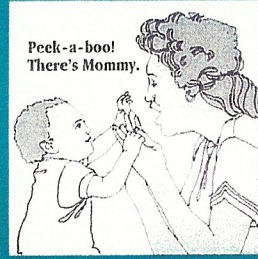
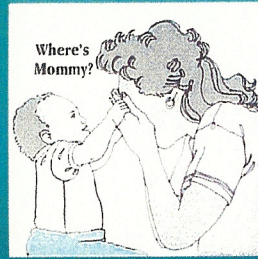
1. Your baby likes to play with things that are their size.
